

Ge 2:8 The Lord God planted a garden toward the east, in Eden; and there He placed the man whom He had formed.

Ge 2:9 Out of the ground the Lord God caused to grow every tree that is pleasing to the sight and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Ge 2:10 Now a river flowed out of Eden to water the garden; and from there it divided and became four rivers.

Ge 2:11 The name of the first is Pishon; it flows around the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold.

Ge 2:12 The gold of that land is good; the bdellium and the onyx stone are there.

Ge 2:13 The name of the second river is Gihon; it flows around the whole land of Cush.

Ge 2:14 The name of the third river is Tigris; it flows east of Assyria. And the fourth river is the Euphrates.

Ge 2:15 Then the Lord God took the man and put him into the garden of Eden to cultivate it and keep it.

Ge 2:16 The Lord God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely;

Ge 2:17 but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die."
